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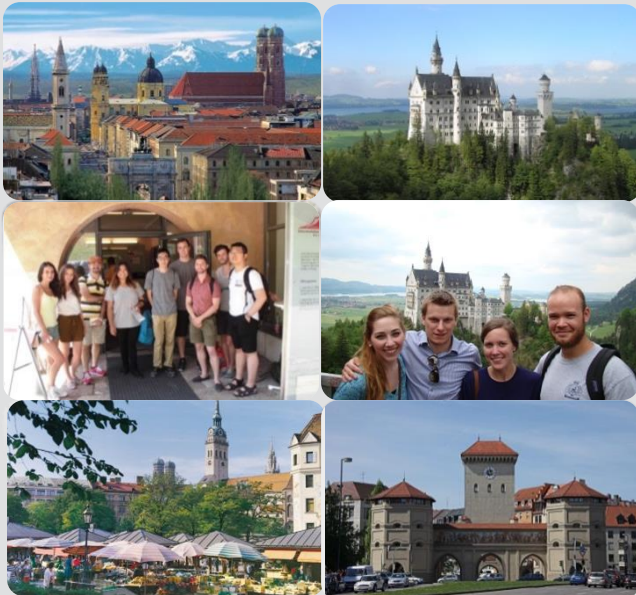

Who can apply?

The Model United Nations summer school program is aimed at students of BA and MA programs of Social and Political, and other related Sciences. Participants are required to have advanced skills in English as well as a vivid interest in politics, international law, and the United Nations.

How to apply?

Contact your home university's international office and provide them with your complete application including your curriculum vitae, letter of motivation, and up-to-date transcript of records.

Application Deadline: April 4th, 2016

Fees and Conditions

The Faculty of Social Sciences will select the best applicants to participate in the summer school program. No tuition fees apply. All participants cover their travel expenses, local public transport, and costs for food and lodging.

About Model United Nations

The students will learn how the United Nations and international diplomacy work, which factors and policies influence international relations and the creation of international law and what the most pressing issues for global peace and security are. Students will understand the rules and procedures of international organisations, train diplomatic conduct, debating and resolution writing and acquire unique skills in researching, negotiating and solving international risks and problems. In addition, students will expand their skills in critical thinking, teamwork, and further develop their leadership abilities.

Topics

► **History of the United Nations**, focusing on The League of Nations and the founding members of the United Nations

► **Central institutions and bodies of the United Nations**, such as the Security Council, general assembly and the ECOSOC and their role

► **Further institutions in the UN-System**, like programs, funds, and specialized agencies and the International Crime Court

► **International Security**, covering Collective Security, Peacebuilding, and the Responsibility to Protect

► **Human Rights**, covering subjects such as the three generations of human rights and International Treaties

► **International Development**, emphasizing Political Economy and the Millennium Development Goals

► **International Environment**,

Climate Change, Disaster reduction and mitigation

► **Free Speech Training**, including addressing the body and representing your country

► **Workshops** on "Rules of procedure" of the United Nations and "resolution writing"

► **A two-day internal simulation of the Security Council or an alternative body**
